If the beneficiary receives social security disability payments (SSDI), rather than supplemental security income (SSI), the trust can also pay for: Property Taxes, Home/Rental Insurance, Rent/Mortgage Payments, Utilities, and Groceries. This list is for illustration only and is by no means exhaustive. It is also important to point out that just because an item appears on the list, that does not mean it will always be allowable or in the beneficiary's best interest. What may be in one beneficiary's interest may not be in the best interest of another. This also means that we may be able to pay for goods and services that do not appear on this list.

* The Arc Master Trust cannot pay for funeral, burial, or cremation expenses initiated after the beneficiary's death.
